Ready and successful schools are prepared to support the learning and development of every child in their community.

Priority strategies:

- **Implement Kindergarten Readiness Assessment (WaKIDS)** (create an assessment of learning and development domains, with information from parents, caregivers and early learning professionals).
- **Implement Phased-In Full-Day Kindergarten** (continue phasing in full-day kindergarten as part of basic education).
- **Align Pre-Kindergarten and K-3 Instructional & Programmatic Priorities** (ensure that children's Pre-K-3rd grade experiences are aligned and coordinated)

• Percent of schools with K-3 student-teacher ratio of 17 to 1 (or fewer) - Updated

Beginning in 2011-2012, kindergarten through third/fourth grade staffing was no longer tracked¹. According to the Common School Provisions the general education average class size of full-time equivalent student per teacher for grades K-3 is 25.23 to 1. During the 2011-2013 biennium and beginning with schools with the highest percentage of students eligible for free and reduced-price meals in the prior school year, the general education average class size for grades K-3 shall be reduced until the average class size is no more than 17.0 full-time equivalent students per teacher beginning in the 2017-18 school year².
